

**City of La Cañada Flintridge
Youth Employment
Ultimate Destination Trail Pocket Park**

Project Detail:

The Ultimate Destination Pocket Park has long been a vision of the La Cañada Flintridge Trails Council, especially Ms. Liz Blackwelder, a longstanding member of the Trails Council, who originally promoted the idea of the pocket park. On January 20, 2009, Ms. Blackwelder donated \$38,000 for the purpose of conveying water to the terminus of the Ultimate Destination Trail within the Cherry Canyon area and creating a small pocket park. The City has also funded a \$68,000. The request to Los Angeles County is in the amount of \$30,000, making the total project cost \$160,000.

The terminus of the Ultimate Destination Trail sits on a small plateau with a 360 degree vista of the City, San Gabriel Mountains, and the surrounding Cherry Canyon area. With the availability of water and oak trees for much-needed shade, this pocket park will become an oasis and a point of destination for many trail users. Oak trees, which are considered a shade tree, are native to the area and are ideal for the purpose of creating this shade.

Once complete, the City will maintain the project.

Scope of Work:

The project consists of the construction of a shaded rest area for hikers, bicyclists, and equestrians at the terminus of the Ultimate Destination Trail. The work includes the installation of a 1½ inch diameter water line, a drinking fountain for trail users, and a water bubbler for horses; planting of approximately fifteen (15) 24 inch diameter oak trees; installation of a drip irrigation system with an irrigation controller.

The source of the water will be provided by the Valley Water Company from a point of connection at the cul-de-sac of Starland Drive, a distance of approximately 1,600 feet.

Tasks that may be performed by At-Risk Youth:

1. Removal of landscaping and vegetation (10 hours)
2. Excavation for the water pipe (70 hours)

Estimate cost of youth employment:

Total estimated hours of youth employment:	80 hours
Estimated Cost per hour:	\$8.00 per hour
Total estimated cost of youth employment:	\$640.00

Method of employing youth:

As part of the projects plans and specifications, the contractor is responsible for seeking at risk youth employment for the project.
