



MAINTAIN YOUR HORSE REGISTRATION

Your Horse Registration is your ticket to maintaining your property's horse keeping rights. If you renew your registration, whether you currently have horses or not, you preserve your property rights for future horse keeping. This is important because the Zoning Ordinance requires that certain distances be maintained between the places on your lot that horses are kept and your neighbor's house. If you fail to maintain your registration, there is a chance that future development on your neighbor's lot may preclude you from meeting the distance requirements for horse keeping and potentially losing your ability to maintain horses on your property. It is only by continued registration that the City knows that your lot predates any neighboring development and that your lot has precedence over the neighboring development for distance separation purposes. This ensures that even though your neighbor may build or add to his house, your distance separation is "grand-fathered" and your ability to maintain horses on your lot will not be precluded.

So if you have had a horse registration on your property, and you wish to ensure preservation of that right, please file your horse registration.
